

Following is a chart of the various morphographic principles, rules, and preskills that are introduced in *Spelling Through Morphographs*.

MORPHOGRAPHIC PRINCIPLES, RULES, AND PRESKILLS		
Lesson 14	<b>Final-E Rule</b>	When a word ends in <b>e</b> and you add a morphograph that begins with a vowel letter, drop the final <b>e</b> .
Lesson 24	<b>Doubling Rule (Short Words)</b>	When a short word ends <b>cvc</b> (consonant-vowel-consonant) and the next morphograph begins with a <b>v</b> (vowel letter), double the final <b>c</b> (consonant letter).
Lesson 32	<b>Vowel-Consonant</b>	<b>Y</b> at the end of a morphograph is a vowel letter.
Lesson 36	<b>Y-to-I Rule</b>	Change the <b>y</b> to <b>i</b> when a word ends with a <b>consonant-and-y</b> , and the next morphograph begins with anything except <b>i</b> .
Lesson 38	<b>Plural Variation</b>	If a word ends in <b>s, z, sh, or ch</b> , you add <b>e-s</b> to make the plural word.
Lesson 41	<b>Plural Variation</b>	If a word ends in <b>s, z, sh, ch, or x</b> , you add <b>e-s</b> to make the plural word. The letter <b>x</b> acts like two consonant letters.
Lesson 47	<b>Contractions</b>	A contraction is made from two words, and a contraction has a part missing. We show that the part is missing with an apostrophe.
Lesson 57	<b>Plural Variation</b>	If a word ends with a <b>consonant-and-y</b> , add <b>e-s</b> to make the plural word.
Lesson 61	<b>Vowel-Consonant</b>	If <b>w</b> is at the end of a morphograph, then it is a vowel letter.
Lesson 87	<b>En Variation</b>	When the word ends in the letter <b>w</b> and you add <b>en</b> , drop the <b>e</b> .
Lesson 95	<b>Al Insertion</b>	When the word ends in the letters <b>ic</b> , you must add the morphograph <b>al</b> before adding <b>ly</b> .
Lesson 101	<b>Plural Variation</b>	Some words that end in the sound <b>fff</b> have the letters <b>ves</b> in the plural. You can always hear the sound <b>vvv</b> in the plural.
Lesson 113	<b>Doubling Rule (Long Words)</b>	When the word ends in a short <b>cvc</b> morphograph, use the doubling rule.
Lesson 118	<b>O-r Ending</b>	Use <b>o-r</b> if a form of the word ends <b>i-o-n</b> .
