SETTING Inside a toyshop. Chorus of toys arranged in group or a semi-circle.

Elves are placing toys in position. Introductory music (Parade of the Wooden

Soldiers) is playing. A busy, happy atmosphere, just before Christmas.

Chorus } SONG: Parade of the Wooden Soldiers [1st verse]

Elves } or music only - played as an introduction.

1st Elf Boy, it's sure been a busy time in Santa's workshop this year!

2nd Elf Yes, this is the last of the toys sent to Earth for Christmas.

3rd Elf Be careful with the doll!

4th Elf Look at the soldiers - aren't they great?

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5th & 6th Elves Let's wind them up [pause] Watch out!

[Elves wind up toy soldiers, who come to life. Soldiers march and dance to instrumental music, (**Parade of the Wooden Soldiers**). They salute at the end. Other toys clap.]

2nd Fairy We've looked everywhere and we can't find it.

3rd Fairy Dearie, dearie, dearie me.

1st Toy We can't have Christmas without the Christmas Spirit,

2nd Toy We must find it.

3rd Toy But where could it be?

4th Toy Boo hoo hoo. I don't want to stay here. I want to go back to Toyland.

[Toys act very sad. Elves and fairies try to console them. All cry at end.]



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
